## Notes from Fr. John



**T**oday we celebrate the First Sunday of Lent. Many of us began Lent this past Wednesday with ashes on our forehead. The ashes were a visible sign that we are followers of Christ, and more importantly that we want to renew ourselves in Christ as well. On Wednesday contrasted regular house cleaning with spring cleaning. On any given day, we might straighten up, dust a bit, put things in their place and call it a day, but with spring cleaning it is a major push to take everything apart, see what has been hidden and needs to be dealt with, and then put it all back together in a better way. That is what Lent is all about. Deep, spring cleaning of our hearts and souls. We are told to rend our hearts so that we can make them better. This is the work of Lent, and our lives. When we do this, then we can stand tall knowing that we have done what God is asking of us. We pray that god will help all of us with our Lenten spring cleaning.

Throughout the season of Lent there are opportunities for reflection and prayer as we hope for change in our lives. Evening prayer is available at both St. Kieran and St. Agnes. At St. Kieran evening prayer is on Thursdays at 7:00 PM. At St. Agnes evening prayer is on Wednesday at 6:30 PM. Stations of the Cross also are available at both parishes. At St. Agnes we have Stations on Friday at 1:30 PM and at 7:00 PM. At St. Kieran the Stations are at 7:00 PM. There is a morning mass at 8:00 AM for both parishes that is celebrated at St. Kieran on Tuesdays-Friday. We also have an 8:15 mass on Thursdays at St. Agnes for the school children and parishioners. For those who are

looking for more quiet time we encourage you to sit an hour in the Divine Mercy Adoration Chapel located in the rectory of St. Agnes.

We also encourage you to do works of mercy as well. Donate food to our food drives, work the food pantry at St. Irenaeus, or volunteer at PADS. Visit someone who is sick or homebound and bring them good news and sunshine. Choose to be more forgiving, less critical and full of joy. Now is the time to be our best.

Today, Sunday March 5th St. Agnes is having their Spaghetti Dinner at the parish center on Halsted and 26th street. The Spaghetti dinner is a chance to bring the community together as well as raise money for the parish and school. The dinner begins at noon and runs until 6:00 PM. Please join us for this delicious fun-raiser. Many volunteers give their time to make this a success. A special thanks to Paul Kapocius who coordinates the kitchen and to all the school families and parishioners who set up, wait tables, clean up, bake and take down. You are a well "olive" oiled machine. Thank you!

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Our faith calls us to stand in solidarity with all. We hear this call in the Gospel of Matthew, when Jesus proclaims, "Whatever you did for one of these least brothers or sisters of mine, you did for me" (Matt 25:40). We hear it in the words of Pope Francis, who invites us to build a culture of encounter: "We are called to reach out to those who find themselves living at the margins of our societies and to show particular solidarity with the most vulnerable of our brothers and sisters: the poor, the disabled, the unborn and the sick, migrants and refugees, the elderly and the young who lack employment."

In the spirit of contributing to such a culture here in the Archdiocese of Chicago, I encourage you to participate in the Catholic Relief Services (CRS) Rice Bowl program during this upcoming Lenten season. The CRS Rice Bowl program provides resources that bring the Lenten pillars of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving to life for families, parishes, and school communities.

In 2016, the Archdiocese of Chicago's generous support enabled CRS to respond to global emergencies in countries such as Columbia, Laos, Rwanda, Honduras, Madagascar, and Haiti. In addition, forty local CRS Rice Bowl grants were distributed to local parishes and organizations which helped to fight hunger and poverty within our own archdiocese. ### Lenten Regulations



Abstinence from meats is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent.

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

The special Paschal fast and abstinence are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.

"The season of Lent is a preparation for the celebration of Easter. The liturgy prepares the catechumens for the celebration of the paschal mystery by the several stages of Christian initiation: it also prepares the faithful, who recall their baptism and do penance in preparation for Easter." (General Norms for the Liturgical Year, #27)

By the threefold discipline of fasting, almsgiving and prayer the church keeps Lent from Ash Wednesday until the evening of Holy Thursday. All of the faithful and the catechumens should undertake serious practice of these three traditions. Failure to observe penitential days totally or a substantial number of such days must be considered serious.

"(On) weekdays of Lent, we strongly recommend participation in daily Mass and self-imposed observances of fasting. In light of grave human needs which weigh on the Christian conscience in all seasons, we urge particularly during Lent, generosity to local, national and world programs of sharing of all things needed to translate our duty to penance into a means of implementing the right of the poor to their part of our abundance," (U.S. Bishops statement on penitential observances, 1966.)



### **Are you unable to come to Church?**

For those who are unable to come to Church on a regular basis and who might like to have Holy Communion brought to them at home are asked simply to contact the business office. Our Ministers of Communion will be more than glad to keep this connection with our praying parish community happening. May our prayers and encouragement continue to go with those who need to know that they are not forgotten.




