Our actions reflect what is in our hearts and souls. Our actions show the world who we are. Today we are once again called to act in accordance to our belief in Jesus Christ.

This week we celebrate the feast of St. Francis of Assisi. We will be having a pet blessing in honor of St. Francis on Saturday, October 7th at 10:00 AM. ARCHDIOCESAN FIREARMS POLICY

The Archdiocese of Chicago is committed to providing safe environments for the community. In the midst of a culture of violence, the Church is a staunch voice to call us to be a place of peace.

The Archdiocese has long had a best practice restricting the presence of firearms in our facilities. Most of our buildings display signage, consistent with the laws of the State of Illinois, indicating that these weapons are prohibited on the premises. Cardinal Cupich recently distributed a Policy aimed at updating and clarifying the Archdiocese's position on the prohibition of firearms on all property it owns and controls.

The Archdiocese respects the Second Amendment to the United States Constitution and recognizes the right to lawfully possess a firearm for personal protection, hunting, or other sports. The Archdiocese has sought to balance the rights of all who visit our properties with the need to protect children, the elderly and other vulnerable populations. However, this Policy is rooted in the belief that our churches and community spaces are intended to be sacred sites where people come to gather, pray, and worship God. There are exceptions to this policy for law enforcement officers, and authorized security personnel.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS SPONSOR THE BABY BOTTLE FUNDRAISING PROJECT!



The Knights of Columbus and St. Kieran Parish will be participating in the Baby Bottle Fundraising Project for the month of October. Empty plastic baby bottles will be available in the church vestibule beginning the weekend of September 30/October 01 for parishioners to take home and fill with spare change. Bottle filled with change may be returned to the church anytime during the month of October. The Baby Bottle Fundraising Drive will formally end with the recitation of the Rosary on Sunday, October 29, following the 10 AM Mass in the church.

Donations from this project will go directly to the Women's Center, based in Evergreen Park, to help in their mission of saving babies from being aborted. In the thirty-two years this organization has been in existence, they have saved over forty thousand babies.

The Women's Center provides financial, material, and spiritual assistance to women who might otherwise seek abortions because they cannot take care of a newborn. They also provide counseling for those women who have experienced abortion and are seeking healing. All of their services are free of charge and, so, they depend on the generosity of others to continue their mission.

We ask our parishioners to be as generous as possible in the effort to help those who cannot help themselves. Our thanks to all who participate in this project!


