Notes from Fr. John



Today we celebrate the Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time. Last week in my homilies I spoke about picking up our crosses and following Jesus. In the homily, I said we all bear personal crosses, but that the greatest cross we bear is that of being Christian. This week our Scripture points it out again. In the book of Ezekiel, we are charged to tell each other when we see a wrong committed. If we don't we are as guilty as the one sinning. The Gospel says the same, but it adds a twist. When the sinner doesn't listen, we are to treat them as we would a "tax collector or Gentile". How did Jesus treat tax collectors and gentiles? Jesus welcomed them and continued to walk with them. So, in the eyes of Jesus no one is disposable. This week President Trump threw out the DACA initiative that protected young immigrants who were brought here as children and had no choice in the matter. They didn't commit a crime as some may say their parents did, and they are contributing to the economy. They can't receive DACA status if they committed a crime. They pay into social security but can't receive benefits because they haven't worked for ten years. They are teachers, lab technicians, soldiers, etc. In fact, their expulsion will have a bad effect on our economy. So why now? And before you speak about law and order, remember this is the President who just pardoned a sheriff who was convicted of a crime. This is the cross we bear. We know what is right even if we don't like it, because

Jesus taught us. As we wait for our Social Security checks, or use our Medicare benefits and soon designate billions for disaster relief (as we should!), remember those fighting for health care, or a chance to stay in this country and contribute to our common good.

Next Sunday we will be celebrating the St. Kieran Parish picnic. The picnic begins at 11:00 AM after the 10:00 AM mass and ends at 3:00 PM. Thanks to the Barkers for all the food and Zarlengo's for the Italian Ice. Music will be provided by Midlife Crisis. This year there will also be a petting zoo and pony rides. Add in some antique cars, and I am not talking about Fr. Tom's, we have quite a day. Thanks to Sheila Porrata and family for their work at organizing the day and making it happen. Finally, thanks to all of the volunteers who work with the leaders to make it a success. Invite your family and friends as we celebrate Saint Kieran.

Finally, today we will be having a second collection for Hurricane relief. This collection is being taken up in every Catholic Church in the country. As we celebrate today we know that another storm now threatens our country and we pray for the relief of those affected by the storms. But prayer isn't always enough; today we are called to action. Please be as generous as you can. Thank You.

Last but not least we want to congratulate Dawn Sternig for receiving the Woman of the Year from the St. Kieran Women's Club. Dawn joins a long list of parishioners who have worked hard for the Women's Club and the parish. Thanks Dawn and congratulations!!

The Vision of the Great Tree

While in the Aran Islands with St. Enda, both monks saw the same vision of a great and fruitful tree growing on the banks of a stream in central Ireland. This tree sheltered the entire island, its fruit crossed the sea surrounding Ireland, and birds came to carry off some of that fruit to the rest of the world. Enda interpreted this vision for his friend by saying, "The great tree is you, Kieran, for you are great in the eyes of God and all people. All of Ireland will be sheltered by the grace in you and many will be nourished by your fasting and prayers. Go to the center of Ireland and found your church on the banks of a stream."

A Cow Comes to Kieran's Aid

A careless monk dropped Kieran's text of the Gospels into the lake surrounding Hare Island where it remained under water for a long time. On a summer day when the cattle went into the lake, the strap of Kieran's book stuck to the foot of one of the cows. When the book was retrieved, it was dry with not a letter blurred or a page destroyed.

A number of years ago, some of our parishioners visited the ruins of St. Kieran's monastery at Clonmacnoise as they were on pilgrimage to the spot. An exhibit of some of the photographs that they took during that trip is on permanent display at the east side of the church vestibule. Our own Celtic Cross in the vestibule is a replica of the same cross from Clonmacnoise.




SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY: Contact the Rectory Office at least six month prior to date of marriage.
