

## Notes from Fr. John



**T**oday we celebrate the Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time. We have two stories about vine yards in today's readings from Scripture. The first from Isaiah tells of a vineyard owner who did every thing possible to make his vineyard a success, but in the end, there was only wild grapes. Since the fields don't produce, he destroys the vines and leaves the fields to other purposes. In the Gospel the story is similar. The owner leaves his fields to servants to care for it and produce a crop for the owner. They decide they want it for themselves and choose to go against the owner. In the end the owner destroys the wicked servants. In both stories the owner of the vineyards is God. We are the servants. If we don't produce or do God's will evil will befall us. If we have ears we need to listen.

On October 26, 2017, at 7:00 PM we will be hosting a second evening on Social Justice and the Church sponsored by St. Agnes, St. Kieran and St. Iraneus parishes. The first evening dealt with the issues around immigration and the building of a wall at our southern border. We watched a video entitled "Gospel Without Borders". In it we were reminded about Jesus' words and actions concerning treatment of those who are alien, foreigners, or refugees in our land. They are to be treated as brothers and sisters. In choosing the topic for the October 26th evening we once again will go back to immigration because it continues to be in the public forum. This time we will discuss the "dreamers" and "DACA", the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals. About 800,000 individuals have received "dreamer" status to date. These are children and young adults who were brought to the United States by their parents and had no choice in the matter. They do not have legal documentation, but have lived their whole life in our country. They are now being told to prepare to go home. But the only home they know is the United States. They are our neighbors, parishioners and friends. They have gone to our schools and

have served in our military. They have met strict criteria to have received "dreamer" status. We owe it to them and to ourselves as followers of Jesus to know and understand who they are and what our government is proposing to do with them. The Scripture this week is pretty clear. We are called to follow the master! Ignoring the issues is not an option. Please join us for this informative evening.

Since I am on issues that should not be ignored, it is time we stand up for just gun control. We are the greatest nation in the world and have the highest mortality rate from guns. Whenever someone tells you now is not the time to talk about gun control, they are wrong. We don't hunt deer with high powered semiautomatic guns. We don't protect ourselves and property with guns that shoot over 400 rounds a minute. No other country in the world has this devastating problem to the degree we do, because they control their gun ownership and use. I am tired of hearing about mass shootings, or the weekly carnage from our streets. This has to end. Make sure our politicians know we are for just gun control. And continue to pray for all those who suffer needlessly.

This week we have published the Annual Financial Report for St. Kieran. Thanks to Sandy Vasek, Bill Brennan and to the St. Kieran Finance committee for all their work and oversight of the parish finances. Thanks also to all of you for your continued support of St. Kieran. Please take a few moments and look at the report and my short comments. Thanks.

### **St. Kieran Catholic Church Annual Report 2016/17**

Today we have once again included our financial report for St. Kieran for fiscal year 7/1/2016-6/30/17. Sandy has done a great job explaining what falls in each of the categories in the report. The bottom line overall is good news. We had a surplus of \$55,645 for the year. This included a small operating deficit of \$37,273 combined with extraordinary income surplus of \$92,918. The extraordinary income comes from Annual Appeal Rebates as well as To Teach Who Christ Is pledge payments. We still carry loans and interest owed the Archdiocese, but we also have a cash balance of \$215,987.

Your generosity has allowed the parish to stabilize and make it so that we will begin our church renovations in January. As a fiscal conservative my only concern is the small operating deficit. We need to continue to move toward a breakeven or surplus operating report. I believe we will get there. If you have questions after hearing or reading the report today, please give me a call. Again, thank you for your continued support.



